Air Force drive. With Spooner's consistently sharp passing and Bellino's hard running...Bellino scored three times in the first half...Navy found little trouble with its offensive game. Fullback Joe Matalavage's lunge from the two yard line, along with Greg Mather's conversion makes it Navy 28, Air Force three. There is more action as the highly-taunted Richi Mayo opens a savage passing attack. But on the Navy 20 yard line, Mayo fades to pass, is hit hard as he lets go the ball, Navy end Frank Datillo intercepts, and gallops 80 yards for the final touchdown of the afternoon. Mather adds the extra-point and the score stand at the final gun, Navy 35, the Air Force Academy, three.
